

EXPEDITED LICENSURE FOR SERVICE MEMBERS AND SPOUSES

In 2019, the Illinois Legislature passed legislation expediting licensure for Service Members and Spouses who are an active duty member or whose active duty service concluded within the preceding two (2) years before application.

Once you or your spouse have submitted all required documents as part of your license application, your application will be reviewed within 30 days.

The Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation (IDFPR) knows how critical it is to military families to begin working as soon as they come to the Prairie State.

GETTING LICENSED

The basics for getting organized and getting licensed:

Gather Your Documents

- Proof of your assignment to a duty station in Illinois or proof that you have or will, within six (6) months, establish legal residence in Illinois.
- Proof of your or your spouse's active military status: DD214, Letter of Service signed by Unit Commanding Officer, or Proof of Service document from the Service Member's electronic personnel portal.
- Proof for Spouses: Military Permanent
 Change of Station Orders with the spouse
 identified by name; Official Notification of
 Change of Assignment with your marriage
 license, a certified DD1172 verifying
 marital status, or a letter signed by the
 commanding officer verifying change of
 assignment and the name of the military
 spouse.
 - Proof of good standing if you are licensed in another state, commonwealth, possession, or territory of the United States, District of Columbia, or foreign jurisdiction.



NEXT STEPS

- Submit a complete set of you or your spouse's fingerprints to the Illinois State Police, if required for your profession.
- Submit your documents and your application for full licensure, and pay any fees required for licensure.
 - As part of your application, you may also be required to submit additional documentation for your license (such as certified transcripts, test results, and/or continuing education certification).

MILITARY LIAISON
